City Council met in regular session with all members present.

Alderman Frank Dickinson opened the meeting with prayer.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read by the Clerk and approved by the Council.

Mr. Frank Dobbs representing the First Federal Savings And Loan Asso. was present and requested that the Council review the tax return of the Association and make an adjustment if possible. Mr. Dobbs stated that he had followed the rules put out by the State of Georgia in making the return. The Council agreed to adjust the tax according the return.

Mr. R. H. Bishop was present and requested that the Council reduce his taxes from a \$2000.00 valuation to \$1750.00 since this was one fourth of the amount he paid for the house on Victory Drive. Mr. Dickinson made a motion that the taxes be reduced to \$1750. This motion was seconded by Mr. David voted on and passed. The Council stated that they would do all they could to furnish Mr. Bishop sewerage in the near future.

Mr. David stated that the people living on Court Street was having trouble with the kids riding bicycles on the sidewalk. No action taken by the Council.


Dickinson stated to the council that the Taxi's stand behind the Calhoun National Bank was having trouble since Tom Robertson was enlarging his store building. There is not enough room for the garbage truck to pick up garbage in the alley with the new addition and the taxi stand still located in the alley. Mr. Edwards made a motion that an ordinance be passed against the parking of automobiles in dead end alley's. That this ordinance also state that the alley's be used for loading and unloading of merchandise only, this to include garbage. This motion seconded by Mr. Dickinson voted on and passed with Mr. David not voting.

Mayor Lawrence stated that Judge Mitchell had set October 4, 1957 as the validation date on the purposed \$ 250,000.00 water and sewerage revenue certificate issue.

Mayor Lawrence stated that October 5 had been set as Industrial Appreciation Day and ask the help of the City Employees and City Officials in making the day a success. Stated that Senators Herman Talmadge and Richard Russell would speak in the city on that date. Mayor Lawrence appointed Alderman Frank Dickinson to be in charge of parking and the roping off of streets on that day.

There being no other business the meeting was adjourned.
