City Council Met in regular session at the City Hall with Alderman Tom David being absent.

Alderman Frank Dickinson opened the meeting with prayer.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read by the clerk and approved by the Council.

~~Commander J. H. Smith~~ and a delegation from the local V. F. W. organization was present and ask some help from the city in cleaning off the lot next to the V.F.W. Home on Line Street. Commander Smith stated that the lot had been purchased from Mr. J.H. Boston and plans were underway to make a play area for the youth of the City. Also stated that plans were to have a little league baseball field. The City Council stated that they would help in any way that they could.

Mr. Frank Walraven of The Walraven Barber Shop on North Wall Street was present and ask that his tax valuation be reduced from \$500.00 to \$300.00 since he only had \$1200.00 worth of equipment. Mr. Edwards made a motion that the tax valuation be reduced to \$300.00 this was seconded by Mr. Woods voted on and passed.

Mr. Frank Richardson was present and requested that the city run water to his property on the Fairmount Road. This line had been in question for some time and after discussion Mr. Edwards makes a motion that the City go ahead with the 6 inch line along the 53 highway and run a 4 inch line from the Fairmount Road through to the Peters Street line giving them more pressure. This motion was seconded by Mr. Dickinson voted on and passed.

Mr. Neal Sutherland of The Veteran Cab Company was present and ask the Council for permission to install a radio tower on top of Victory Drive near the present two-way radio tower belonging to the City and other agencies. The City agreed to grant this permission. Mr. Sutherland also wanted to park his cabs on South Court Street for the present until he had his two-way system installed. The Council told Mr. Sutherland that he would have to see Commissioner John Slagle for this permission since the Parking Meters on South Court Street belonged to the County.

Mr. Edwards stated that the Fire And Police Dept's were having trouble getting their new clothes delivered. Mr. Edwards stated that he planed to call the factory in Cinn. Ohio the next day.

There being no other business Mr. Edwards made a motion to adjourn seconded by Mr. Dickinson voted on and Passed.
