

1. Rev. John Allen delivered the invocation.
2. Minutes of the Feb. 26 meeting read and approved.
3. Ald. Mathews introduced Jess Wilson to all present. Mr. Wilson is to assume the duties of City Clerk and Treasurer on March 26.
4. Frank Burnette announced that local contractors have formed an association and suggested certain changes. Mayor Dickinson requested Ald. Cox and Collins to meet with the group.
5. Ald. Mathews heard in regard to a package malt beverage license for Ben D. Morrow at a Fairmount Highway (SR 53) location; referred to Ald. Cox, chairman of the special license committee.
6. Ald. Padgett reported that Brown Steel Contractors, Newnan, Ga. were low bidders on the 2 - 2 million gallon water reservoirs at \$256,075.00 and moved acceptance of their bid, 2nd by Ald. Cox and passed by the Council.
7. Ald. Padgett moved approval of 2 water taps, 2nd by Ald. Cox and OK'd.
8. Ald. Padgett said he had been asked to have the intersection of College and Fain Sts. again controlled by a traffic light. Supt. Owens to contact the Dept. of Transportation for approval.
9. Ald. Mathews asked about the proposed lease of the building on N. Court St. which formerly housed Starr- Mathews Agency. Action postponed until the March 26 meeting.
10. Ald. Padgett requested Ald. Cox, chairman of the Police Comm., to instruct Chief Hayes to enforce the parking regulations in the Gordon Hills Shopping Center.
11. Ald. Padgett advised that apparently no progress is being made on the wall to prevent further erosion of Victory Drive at the Gordon Hills Shopping Center. Supt. Owens to contact an engineering firm for their recommendation to correct this problem.
12. Asst. Supt. Fox estimated it will cost \$24,000.00 to extend a water main from the Goodyear plant to Belwood School. Mr. Fox advised that the Gordon Co. Board of Education and Frank J. Richardson will pay the cost if given rebates for the water users the city acquires along the present road. Mayor Dickinson referred the matter to Ald. Padgett.
13. Mr. Fox said we have promised to extend a 2" water line into Don Sanders' subdivision, but the State Health Dept. will not approve it. Ald. Padgett suggesting leaving it to the developer to get state approval.
14. Following discussion, Ald. Padgett moved to install a water main to permit A. H. Scoggins, dba Scoggins-McBrayer Furniture, to install a sprinkler system in his building with Mr. Scoggins to pay the cost and the city to provide sprinkler service at no charge for 8 years-no interest charges to be included. Ald. Mathews seconded and the motion was voted on and passed.
15. Mr. J. C. Boyd, member of the Calhoun-Gordon County Planning Commission and chairman of the Zoning Board of Appeals, said that enforcement of the building code section requiring the submission of plans showing the location of a building on the lot prior to issuance of a building permit would prevent re-


15. occurrence of problems such as encountered with James Jones Construction on Jr. Millsaps building on Chandler St. Council ordered all future building permits must be issued by the Building Inspector.
16. Council agreed that the old College St. school building on the South side of the lot be torn down as soon as possible.
17. Ald. Padgett moved to adjourn, 2nd by Ald. Cox and done.
