

APRIL 9, 1973 - REGULAR MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL WITH ALL PRESENT
EXCEPT ALD. BILL MATHEWS.

1. Invocation delivered by Rev. John Allen.
2. Minutes of previous meeting read and approved.
3. Mrs. Beverly Langford brought the council up to date on recreation requirements.
4. Mrs. Holt Shauser asked for a variation of zoning on an addition to her home. She presented documented proof her neighbors approved. Motion made by Ald. Collins, seconded by Ald. Cox, passed.
5. Calfee's Minute Market application for malt beverage license denied, no vote taken.
6. Ald. Collins recommended the metal building at the water tank be made more attractive. Referred to Roy Fox.
7. Ald. George Cox to meet again with plumbers and electricians for fees for out of town contractors.
8. Schools behind in utilities, referred to Hoyt Edwards to contact the school superintendent and report at next meeting.
9. Mr. Edge requested the city accepting only the last 6 years taxes on the Velma Hunt for M. H. Harris Estate. Motion to deny made by Ald. Cox, seconded by Ald. Billy Padgett, motion denied.
10. Motion by Ald. Cox, seconded by Ald. Ted Collins to standardize beer tax at \$.00333 cents per ounce, regardless of size of container. Passed.
11. Beer distributor requested 3% discount on tax to be paid to City motion to deny made by Ald. Collins, seconded by Ald. Cox, motion denied.
12. Gordon County Medical Professional Association protested their business license fees. Motion by Ald. Collins, 2nd by Ald. Cox to leave fee as is. Passed.
13. Land owners to pay for demolition of their buildings if not condemned. Referred to Ald. Ted Collins.
14. Ray Davis, building inspector, recommended adoption of building permit fee system as listed in the Southern Building Code motion by Ald. Collins, 2nd by Ald. Cox. Passed.
15. Jack Bell brought up problems involving other Electric Companies, specifically, whose responsibility for providing power to customers where problems might arise. Jack Bell is going to obtain more information on this matter.
16. Roy Fox brought up the house the city bought in the cotton mill. Council voted unanimously to auction the house.
17. Sidewalks south from the Family Budget Store to corner on Park Ave. need replacing. The council unanimously agreed.
18. City Clerk asked permission to purchase calculator and adding machine. Motion by Ald. Padgett, 2nd by Ald. Cox. Passed.
19. Ald. Padgett made motion to adjourn, 2nd by Ald. Collins and done.
