

1. Invocation given by Rev. John Allen.
2. Minutes of previous meeting read and accepted.
3. Dr. Bishop came before the council pertaining to the bill he received from the city. He stated that James Owens agreed to put in water main if Dr. Bishop deeded property to the city, then all he would have to pay for was the fire hydrant. References from the minutes were read. Referred to Tom Shanahan and Hoyt Edwards to discuss with James Owens and report back to the council.
4. One bid received on proposed dog pound, when two other bids are received they will be opened. Ordinance referred to Ald. Mathews, Ald. Cox, Tom Shanahan and Hoyt Edwards. They are to report back to the council.
5. Tom Shanahan brought up utility bills. The procedure of allowing customers going 2 months prior to cut off would conflict with the proposed ordinance. Bill reads cut off after 5 days. After draft system is installed the higher deposit of \$30.00 for electric service and \$20.00 for water will be necessary prior to reconnecting service, also when draft system is installed the cut off utilities after 5 days past the gross date will start. Motion by Ald. Padgett, 2nd by Ald. Mathews. Carried.
6. Tom Shanahan presented ordinance for School Bonds for \$225,000. Lex Jolley quoted on interest rate of not more than 6%. Motion by Ald. Collins, 2nd by Ald. Padgett, carried.
7. Ald. Padgett moved to dispense with the reading of the school bond ordinance, 2nd by Ald. Mathews, carried.
8. Mr. Wayne Bennett requested permission to use a converted mobile home as an office for W & R Used Cars, council approved this for 6 months as a temporary office. Motion by Ald. Collins, 2nd by Ald. Cox, carried.
9. Mr. Lovingood came before the council about his application for annexation into the city. Cost to run sewer line approximately \$4,000 according to Roy Fox. Referred to Hoyt Edwards, Ald. Padgett, Bruce Bowman and Jack Bell. They are to report back to the council at next meeting.
10. Mr. Powell representing Charles Williams Real Estate Investment Co. came to discuss zoning on Carriage Apartments. Referred to Hoyt Edwards, Roy Fox and Jack Bell.
11. Ald. Cox reported newspaper receptacles are to close to streets. He also gave bids on new motorcycle. Low bid of \$450.25 received from George's Recreation, Inc. Motion by Ald. Cox, 2nd by Ald. Mathews, carried.
12. Ald. Mathews wants inventory of city cars.
13. City Clerk was instructed to contact Cable TV Company and have franchise tax brought up to date within 60 days.

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14. Bid of Ledbetter Construction of \$501.00 for house on Red Bud Road accepted, house to be moved within 60 days of completion of project. Motion by Ald. Collins, 2nd by Ald. Cox, carried.
15. A resolution concerning the City and the Georgia Department of Transportation was read and approved.
16. The sum of \$.12 per mile was authorized to be paid to city employees driving their own cars on city business. Motion by Ald. Mathews, 2nd by Ald. Collins, passed.
17. Letter of appreciation from city school board read.
18. City Clerk was instructed to get with the City School Superintendent to discuss the 1973-74 school budget.
19. Petition to annex property of Arnold Tippens read and approved provided the county allows the City the taxes for 1973. If the city is not allowed to collect taxes for 1973. Property will not be annexed until Jan. 1, 1974. Motion by Ald. Cox, 2nd by Ald. Mathews, carried.
20. Jack Bell thanked all the city employees for their help during the recent storm.
21. Motion by Billy Padgett to approve 4 water taps, 2nd by Ald. Mathews, carried.
22. Hoyt Edwards reported he had a bid of \$8800 for demolition of school buildings, also a bid at no cost, if the city would allow approximately 3 months for the demolition. Tabled.
23. Motion to adjourn made by Ald. Padgett, 2nd by Ald. Mathews, done.
