

MAY 14, 1973 - REGULAR MEETING OF THE CITY COUNCIL WITH ALL PRESENT
EXCEPT ALD. BILLY PADGETT.

1. Invocation delivered by Rev. John Allen.
2. Minutes read, corrected and approved.
3. Ald. Mathews brought up utility bill for recreation department. Recreation department pays its own bill.
4. Ald. Mathews requested increased protection for the recreation department in the summer evenings.
5. Sewer service for Lovingood meat processing brought up by Ald. Mathews. This is outside the city limits, referred to Roy Fox.
6. The mayor read the estimates of the four requests made by the Concerned Citizens of the Black Community, that were presented at the last meeting of the city council.
 - a. A new building is under planning for the Recreation Department, approximate cost in excess of \$400,000.00
 - b. Lights at the track field referred to the Recreation Department.
 - c. Covering drainage ditch, the Mayor stated that material estimate was \$40,000.00 and labor estimated at \$30,000.00. If the land owners purchase the material the city will furnish the labor.
 - d. Street situation on the adjoining new street to pave with asphalt would cost \$25,000.00. The City will participate in 1/3 of cost if land owners pay 2/3. A sketch of the building requested by the Concerned Citizens of the Black Community was submitted to the Council.
7. Hoyt Edwards reported progress on the fire hydrants at Sherwood and Devonwood also Dr. Bishop's street still under consideration.
8. Priority list of projects read by Roy Fox. He recommended relocating line and installing 8" line on Ga. 156. Relocate line and put in an 8" line. Passed.
9. Roy Fox brought up Ledbetter Construction Company. They are allowed to use lot adjacent to house that is to be auctioned.
10. Cutting of grass at airport. \$200.00 deposit required, when all hay is cut deposit returned.
11. Change out light at Rev. Gardner's house when practical.
12. New shopping center is to request all city utilities.
13. Cut off charges on utilities to be increased within the city to \$5.00 and outside the city to \$7.00. Deposits on electric service to be increased to \$30.00 and deposits on water to be increased to \$20.00. Motion to be adopted by Ald. Mathews, 2nd by Ald. Collins. Carried.
14. Jack Bell reported on Power Bill meeting he and Hoyt Edwards attended. Upon Ald. Padgett's return a called meeting will be held of the council.

15. Eleven water taps approved. Motion by Ald. Cox, 2nd by Ald. Mathews. Carried.
16. Billy Lackey voiced his appreciation to the City Council for their support. He is to come back to work Tuesday, May 15, 1973.
17. Motion to accept bid of Collier Construction Co. for foundation of 2 two millngallon water reservoirs. Motion by Ald. Cox, 2nd by Ald. Mathews. Passed.
18. An appeal of case #399, Charles K. Waggoner who was fined in City Court. Fine was upheld. Mayor pro-term Cox held the hearing. The city clerk was asked to check into the price of decibel meter and acceptable decibels on mufflers for all motor vehciles. Motion by Ald. Mathews, 2nd by Ald. Cox. Carried.
19. Reference to minutes of April 9, 1973 city council meeting paragraph 10. The following ordinances of the City of Calhoun were repealed:
