


1. Invocation given by Ald. Mathews.
2. Minutes of the regular meeting, Oct. 28, 1974, read and approved.
3. Mayor Burdette stated that each council meeting hereafter would follow an agenda. The public would still be able to interject any ideas or questions, but the councilmen would be requested to submit any new business several days early in order to get it placed on the agenda. The clerk also recommended that any subjects discussed by the council that would require an ordinance be discussed at one meeting and voted on at the next, giving the attorney time to draw the ordinance.
4. The clerk reported the findings on the questions of workgangs for the City. The clerk cited two ordinances in the Code, Section 2-20 and Section 1-9, granting the City this power. Due to recent Supreme Court rulings this would be on a volunteer basis in lieu of bond rather than by any mandatory requirements.
5. The clerk presented a request for a 3% tax on insurance premiums covering real property with these funds being directed toward the fire department. After discussion, the council felt the proposal should have more study and be altered before being approved.
6. Attorney Billy Bailey presented Mr. Charles Williams, owner of the Carriage Apartment complex in Calhoun. Mr. Williams discussed in detail the rent supplement program that was submitted at the last council meeting. Upon determining that the program would benefit some of the handicapped and elderly citizens, and would not be detrimental to the other apartment owners since they could not qualify for the federal funds, the council voted to adopt the resolution. The council did stipulate that the resolution could be dissolved if proper maintenance and order was not kept.
7. Ald. Lewis stated that he had had a number of complaints concerning the new billing of WEBS Cable TV. The clerk was asked to contact WEBS regarding this practice and present details at the next council meeting.
8. Ald. Collins stated that the hedges at the shopping center needed trimming, since they were becoming a road hazard.
9. Hoyt Edwards and Roy Fox stated that they had done a cost estimate on water being extended to the Sugar Valley Baptist Church. This extension would cost approximately \$22,500.00. These figures were given to Forrest Holsomback, a spokesman for the Church.
10. Joe Talley was granted a mobile home permit for a six months period. Motion by Ald. Mathews, 2nd by Ald. Collins and approved. It was stressed by the council that all such permits would be subject to electrical and plumbing requirements. The council requested the clerk to prepare a calendar on outstanding permits for mobile homes.

12. A motion to adjourn was made by Ald. Collins, 2nd by Ald. Padgett and approved.
