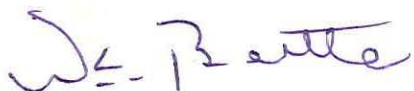


1. Invocation given by Rev. John Allen of Belmont Baptist Church.
2. Minutes of Sept. 9, 1974, regular meeting read and approved.
3. The business license of Jerry Davis was discussed -- question of business being a wrecker service or junk yard. Motion by Ald. Padgett to have Jerry Davis erect an eight foot high wooden (dressed lumber) fence or remove all junk cars by the first of the year or no new business license for 1975 will be issued, 2nd by Ald. Lewis and approved.
4. Discussion by Council on city citizens being charged out of town water rates if they use other sources of electrical power rather than those of the City. No motion after a call by the Mayor.
5. After a request by Doyle Fowler, Ald. Collins made the motion that Doyle Fowler's property with the new commercial building be annexed into the City under C-2 zoning, effective Jan. 1, 1975 with sewerage hook-up to begin immediately, 2nd by Ald. Padgett. Approved by the Council.
6. Discussion by Earnest Ralston pertaining to his Aug. 26, 1974, request for re-zoning of his commercial property on Highway 53. The Mayor suggested that Mr. Ralston obtain legal council in reference to a appeal.
7. Mayor Burdette asked that a copy of the franchise request from WEBS Cable TV be made a part of the minutes regarding the approval given to New Echota Broadcasting Co., on Jan. 27, 1969. A new request was submitted by WEBS to make the franchise exclusive. After discussion by the Council the matter was postponed until the Council had time to study both the pole agreement and the ordinance.
8. A request was made by Ronald Chance that he not be liable for any taxes on the lot directly behind the Post Office since he had given the City permission to use it as a parking lot. A Motion by Ald. Lewis that Mr. Chance not pay any taxes on the lot for the years 1974 and 1975 was 2nd by Ald. Padgett and approved by the Council.
9. A request was made by the Gordon County Chamber of Commerce for funds from both the City and County to help establish an Industrial Commission to attract additional and diversified industry. A motion was made by Ald. Padgett that the City help on a 50-50 basis with the County up to a maximum of \$2500.00 annually, 2nd by Ald. Collins and approved.
10. Discussion of speed breakers being erected at the recreational park. A motion was made by Ald. Padgett that this matter be discussed with City's legal council and the project started if given legal approval. Ald. Padgett asked that proper signs be erected simultaneously with the breakers, 2nd by Ald. Lewis and approved by the Council

11. Mayor Burdette asked that each Councilman express his opinion to the management of the local theater and drive-in regarding the numerous R rated movies shown.
12. A request by Smith's Bargain Barn was made to open on Sunday for business. The Council refused to take any action on the matter at the present time.
13. Mayor Burdette asked the Council to consider forming a Ladies Committee to work in conjunction with the Planning Commission on a beautification project for the City. The Council was in complete agreement and Mayor Burdette was asked to appoint the committee and use limited funds for the project.
14. George Hayes made a request that some action be taken on the hazardous intersection at 53 and 41. Mayor Burdette asked that Police Chief Hayes contact the Cartersville Dept. of Transportation since they designed and installed the original lights.
15. The petition for a beer license by A & W Root Beer was discussed. After Mr. Hobgood, the owner, agreed that there would be no employees under 18 and no curb beer sales, a motion was made by Ald. Collins for the sale of beer inside the facility with continued curb service for food. A 2nd was given by Ald. Lewis and approved by the Council.
16. Jack Bell announced that a meeting of the Power Commission would be in Atlanta in the near future and he urged that the Mayor and Councilmen make every effort to attend as this would be an important meeting.
17. A motion by Ald. Collins was made to annex the Mr. and Mrs. J. L. Turk property into the city effective Jan. 1, 1975, 2nd by Ald. Padgett and approved.
18. A request was made by Colorset to increase the water supply to their business. After discussion Mayor Burdette asked Hoyt Edwards and Roy Fox as well as Mr. Watt of TLM Associates to confer with Colorset in regard to the problems of increased water demand and the sewerage disposal capacity involved.
19. Motion to adjourn was made by Ald. Collins, 2nd by Ald. Padgett and approved.
