City Council met in regular session at the City Hall with all members present.

Chief Hayes opened the meeting with prayer.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read by the clerk and adopted by the council.

Mr. Dickinson made a motion that the outside woodwork on the city hall be painted. This motion was seconded by Mr. David voted on and passed. The council instructed Mr. McDaniel to take bids on the job and proceed with the painting.

Mr. Dickinson made a motion that 3-12 minute parking meters be installed on the North side of Harlan Street from Wall to the entrance of the Post-office driveway . This motion was seconded by Mr. Woods voted on and passed.

Mr. Spink made a motion that the "no left turn " sign on waal at the entrance to Harlan Street be taken down. This motion was seconded by Mr. Dickinson voted on and passed.

Mr. David made a suggestion that the ditch on the South side of the County jail be fixed as it was in need of tile. Mr. McDaniel stated that he would look into the matter.

Mr. David stated that Mr. Sam Boston on Harlan Street was having trouble with a private sewer line that run through the yard of Mr. Bill Bond and wanted to know if the city would help him out. After discussion the council stated that they would run a line toward Gordon Avenue if the property owners would pay the usual \$50.00 tap fee for sewerage.

Mr. Dickinson made a motion that 3 parking spaces on Park Avenue be marked for "Doctors Only" for Doctors Richards, Purcell, Thompson and that a charge of \$2.00 per month be charged for ~~each~~ space. This motion was seconded by Mr. Spink voted on and passed.

Mayor Edwards stated that he had been ask if the City of Calhoun would take into consideration the subleasing of the park on the West side of the railroad and East side of King Street to a private individual. The matter was tabled.

Mr. A. A. Graves, City School Superintendent, and Mr. Paul Shoffner, Mr. Jack Henslee of the City School Board were present and ask the City Council to take into consideration calling for a bond vote up to \$60,000.00 for classrooms, bandroom, improvements at football field, and other needed improvements at the white and colored schools. After discussion Mr. David made a motion that Mr. Lex Jolley of the Robinson-Humphrey Co. be contacted and proceed with the issueing of bonds up to \$60,000.00 if possible or any amount that can be issued. Mr. Dickinson seconded this motion voted on and passed.

Mr. Dickinson made a motion that Mayor Edwards be authorized to sign an agreement between the City of Calhoun And Southern Railway System for a water pipe crossing at Plainville, Georgia and Sugar Valley, Georgia. This motion seconded by Mr. Spink voted on and passed.

There being no other business Mr. David made a motion to adjourn seconded by Mr. Spink voted on and passed.


