May 12, 1958

City Council met in regular session with Bill W. Spink being the only member absent.

Chief Hayes opened the meeting with prayer.

Proper corrections were made to the minutes and approved by the council.

Mr. Claude Nichols representing the wife of the late Lawrence Nichols and the Texas ~~Oil~~ Co. was present and ask the council for permission to build a ~~service~~ station and small bulk plant on the lot on South Wall Street owned by the late Lawrence Nichols. Mr. Nichols presented a blue print of the proposed station and after study by the council Alderman Dickinson made a motion that permission for the station and bulk plant be granted. this motion was seconded by Alderman David voted on and passed. There was some question about a fence that would be built around the plant but the council stated that this matter could be settled after the plant was built.

Mr. Paul Gentry was present and ask that his beer application be voted on. Mayor Edwards informed Mr. Gentry that a vote wasn't necessary since he had not been a resident of the City of Calhoun for the past two years and this was a requirement for all people issued a beer permit.

Alderman David stated to the council that Dr. Ben Youmans wanted permission from the city to extend the Deluxe Dry Cleaning Building on Piedmont Street out on the sidewalk one brick since he had bought the building and was planning a remodeling job.. After discussion Mr. David made a motion that this permission be granted seconded by Mr. Woods voted on and passed.


Alderman David ask permission of the council to send a city truck to Atlanta and Macon to pick up Civil Defense trailers. Mr. Woods made a motion to grant this permission seconded by Mr. Dickinson voted on and passed.

Mr. David made a motion that the Fire Chief be given permission to answer fire calls to any county school without going through the mayor and council if this would meet with the approval of the Southeastern Underwriters. There was no second to the motion.

Mr. David reported that the Nashville's Booster's Club would be through Calhoun on May 27th at 10:30 am and arrangements had been made for a coffee break at the high school cafeteria with the city paying for the coffee and donuts. Council was in agreement on this matter.

Mr. David made a motion that a resolution commending Governor Griffin and his administration for the street improvement be made a part of the record and entered as such in the official minutes of the City of Calhoun. Copy of Resolution attached. This motion seconded by Mr. Woods voted on and passed.

There being no other business the meeting was adjourned.
