

Calhoun, Georgia
September 22, 1958

City Council met at the city hall with all members present.

Chief Hayes opened the meeting with prayer.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read by the clerk and approved by the council.

John Flemming a colored citizen from Line Street was present and requested the council to have the city fill in around his house with dirt. Wanted the back filled in as well as the front. Mr. McDaniel stated that it would take from 50 to 75 loads of dirt to fill the entire property and this would cause water to be turned onto other property.. Council agreed to let Mr. McDaniel look into the matter and fill in where necessary and fill as much as possible without turning water on other property.

Mr. David reported that the ditch under Court Street on West Side needed cleanning. Council instructed City Engineer McDaniel to look into the matter.

Mr. Bob McEntyre requested that the Council cut his taxes on his property on South Wall Street. Stated that the property was in a run down condition on he was unable to rent at the present. After discussion the council decided to leave the tax as set.

A letter was read by the Mayor from Madison Byrd protesting the valuation put on his store building on North Wall Street, Mr. Byrd ask the council to look into the matter and give his tax return consideration. After discussion the tax were left as set by the council.

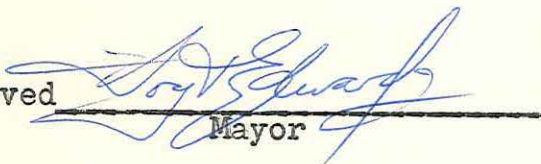
City Council agreed to let Mr. Lamar Squires work on all the two-way radios and present a bill for each radio worked on at the end of each month.

Mr. Woods made a motion that the city ordinance for monument erection be changed to read as follows: Each Company must pay a fee of \$10.00 per monument or a yearly fee of \$50.00. If \$10.00^{10¢} is paid each time a monument is set the fee will still be paid when the yearly fee of \$50.00 has been reached. This motion seconded by Mr. David voted on and passed.

Mr. David made a motion that the tax millage for the City of Calhoun for the year 1958 be set at 22 mills. This being 2 mills above the 1957 figure due to a \$50,000.00 bond issue voted for school improvements. This motiom was seconded by Mr. Dickinson voted on and passed.

There being no other business the meeting was adjourned.
