Calhoun, Georgia

City Council met in regular session with all members present.

Chief opened the meeting with prayer.

Minutes of the previous meeting read and adopted.

Council agreed to meet Thursday, August 28th at 5pm for the purpose of discussing and adopting the Ordinance for acquiring \$ 30,000 in water and sewerage revenue certificates from the Robinson-Humphrey Company at $4\frac{1}{2}\%$. This issue was handled by Mr. Lex Jolley of the Robinson-Humphrey Company.

Mr. Woods reported that the drain on Hicks Street in front of the Louise Hall house was stopped up and needed work done on it.

Mr. Woods reported that ^{Nothing} new had developed on the new armory for Calhoun. Also reported that the local guard was having Federal Inspection in the month of September and that the entrance to the armory needed some gravel on it. Mr. Woods made a motion that the city spread some gravel on the entrance to the armory seconded by Mr. David voted on and passed.

Mr. Spink reported to the Council that Mr. Norman Miller Jr. had reported dust was on the street in front of his house and asked the city to do something about it as it was getting in his house. It was decided that the dust was coming from a spot between the street and sidewalk and it was customary for the property owner to pay for gravel used on said spots. Mr. Spink agreed to contact Mr. Miller and see if he wanted to pay for the gravel.

Council instructed City Engineer to paint the yellow curb and no parking sign in front of the Civic Center and line-off parking spaces in front of the two new parking meters by the post office. Also instructed Police Chief Hayes to make a list of speeding signs needed and have city engineer order and install same.

Mr. David ask council for okay to purchase two generators that would run old water plant in case of an emergency. These two generators would be three phase and would work okay at the old plant. Council's okay's payment for said generators which would run in the neighborhood of \$100.00 Would be bought through the Civil Defense Department.

Mayor Edwards reported that the Sequoyah Garden Club wanted a water faucet installed on the outside at the Civic Center so the yard could be watered. Also wanted to know the price of some trash barrels to be used at the Civic Center.

Mr. David reported that the State Health Department wanted to build a Health Center in the City of Calhoun with funds from Federal, State, and County. Each furnishing $\frac{1}{3}$ the cost of building. Some question of building the Center on the State owned property near the L&N Depot that is now under lease to the city and used as a city park. After discussion Mr. Dickinson made a motion that the city give permission for building the Center on the said property seconded by Mr. Woods voted on and passed.

Mayor stated to the council that he had had complaints from residents on Wander Street complaining of Insurance rates being raised because there was no fire plug within 1000 feet of some of the homes. City Engineer was instructed to look into the matter and report at the next meeting.

A letter from the School Board was read requesting \$51,300 for operating the City School System for the year 58-59. Council stated they would give the school board all the money received from 15 mills tax as set out by the City Charter.

There being no other business the meeting was adjourned.
