City Council met in regular session with all members present.

Police Chief Crofford Hayes opened the meeting with prayer.

MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING READ AND APPROVED.

Mr. Lex Jolley of the Robinson-Humphrey Company was present at the request of the City of Calhoun in regard to selling of \$30,000.00 worth of Water and Sewer Revenue Certificates for purpose of running water to the Echota Mill and relieving the Sewer problem on Oothcalooga Street with a line to the Creek. After discussion Alderman Dickinson made a motion that the City of Calhoun sign a contract with the Robinson-Humphrey Company for the sale of \$30,000.00 worth of Water and Sewerage Revenue Bonds at interest rate of 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ % to run from 1960 through 1976. This motion was seconded by Mr. Tom David voted on and passed by the Council. This issue was to be attached to the previous issues on the City water system. Copy of Contract attached. Signed by Mayor and Clerk.

Mr. Woodrow Cochran from the Calhoun Cab Company was present and ask the Council to let him operate his cab company from the spaces around the County Courthouse. Stated that he had contacted Mr. John Slagle County Commissioner, and that Mr. Slagle had no objection if it was alright with the City Council. Mr. David made a motion that the Calhoun Cab Company be permitted to operate from spaces around the courthouse as long as they fed the parking meters. This motion was seconded by Mr. Dickinson voted on and passed.

James Shopshire a colored citizen from Westside was present and requested that the City move the Minnie Shopshire house on West Line Street and underpin same. Council agreed to move the house as soon as details could be worked out and the money was available. Shopshire also stated that some hogs were smelling near homes on westside and requested that the city do something to have this odor stoped. Council instructed Chief of Police to look into the matter.

City Council okeyed the transfer of 12 Civil Defense bunk beds and mattresses to the Gordon County Hospital for emergency use. Also agreed to the Calhoun Q&Back Club using 30 beds and mattresses for a football camp to be held at camp Sidney Dew.

Mr. Spink made a motion that the traffic Ordinances as drawn up by Chief Hayes be adopted into a Traffic Code. This motion seconded by Mr. Dickinson voted on and passed. Copy of Code to be properly stamped and placed on file in the Clerk's Office.

Council agreed to have the roof fixed at the civic center and inspect the stands at the baseball field and see if they thought they were worth spending \$1,000 on to fix.

There being no ther business the meeting was adjourned.
