Calhoun, Georgia

City Council met in regular session with all members present

Chief Hayes opened the meeting with prayer.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read by the clerk and approved by the council.

An application for a retail malt beverage license by Mr. Paul Gentry was read at this time. After discussion Mr. Dickinson made a motion that the application be taken under consideration and voted on at the next regular meeting.

Mr. Woods stated that he was not satisfied with the way the cemetery sexton had been handling his job for the past few weeks also the way he had been personally conducting himself. Mr. Woods made a motion that George Silvers be dismissed effective May 3rd, 1958 with an extra two weeks pay. Also that James H. Fuller be hired as the new sexton at the same salary and with house rent free but he must pay for utilities. Mr. Fuller would start his job as soon as he was released from the police force. This motion was seconded by Mr. Dickinson voted on and passed.

Mr. Dickinson reported that two city employees had been using city equipment after working hours without proper permission. Mr. Dickinson made a motion that Alex Harris and Albert Gallman be dismissed for using city equipment after working hours without permission effective May 3rd, 1958. There was no second to the motion. *COUNCIL INSTRUCTED CITY ENGR. Mc DANIEL TO REPRIMAND HARRIS AND GALLMAN.*

Mr. A. A. Graves was present and stated that he had talked with the state architect about building new classrooms onto the high school building and the architect had given his ok to start plans. Mr. Graves stated that he was getting bids on 2 classrooms and on 4 classrooms just in case the bond issue didn't pass.

Mr. McDaniel reported that the citizens outside the county at Plainville wanted a fire plug. After discussion the matter was tabled.

Mayor Edwards reported that a number of colored citizens had talked to him about getting a colored policeman for the colored section of town. After discussion Mr. Dickinson expressed belief that at this time there was no need for a colored policeman. The matter was tabled.

There being no other business Mr. David made a motion to adjourn seconded by Mr. Dickinson voted on and passed.
