City Council met in regular session with all members present.

The meeting was opened with prayer by the Clerk.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read by the Clerk and approved by the Council.

Ailene Fleeming a colored citizen living on West Line Street was present and ask the Council to move the family house back from the street and fill in around it. Mr. Spink made a motion that the house be moved back and piers put under it at the earliest possible date. This motion was seconded by Mr. Dickinson voted on and passed.

Mr. Spink stated to the Council that Miss Blanche Gardner had made a request that the city pave Fair Street over to the ditch in front of her home property. Mayor Edwards appointed Mr. Spink to look into the matter and report back at the next meeting.

Mr. Dickinson instructed the Police Department to stop the snowball man from selling snowballs on Fair Street near the ball park.

Mr. McDaniel, City Engineer, reported to the council that a proposed sanitary sewer line to relieve the condition that exist on Oothcalooga Street would cost approximately \$5,000.00. No Action taken at this time.

Sgt. George Hayes of the Police Department reported to the Council that a group of boys in Plainville had been caught stealing wheels and tires off of City equipment. Council agreed to prosecute subjects according to law.

At this time a letter from the Southeastern Underwriter Association was read by the Mayor to the Council regarding fire protection between the City and County for the 849 District. The Underwriter's Association stated that it would take two additional firemen and a new fire truck to get a good rating. No action taken on matter until a meeting with the County could be held.

Mayor Edwards stated that the Fire Department had made a request for additional pay since the County radio's had been added to the City frequency. Stated this put additional work on them. Alderman Woods suggested that the County be asked for \$25.00 per month for each fireman. Mayor Edwards stated that he would ask the County Commissioner for the money at a future meeting.

A sanitary Sewer line for Mr. Sam Boston On Harlan Street was discussed at this time. After discussion Alderman David made a motion that if Mr. Boston would pay for the pipe plus the \$50.00 tap fee that the City Would dig the ditch and lay the line. This motion was seconded by Mr. Dickinson voted on and passed.

Mr. David made a motion that the beer ordinance be amended to require six \$.96 stamps on a 15.2 gal. keg of beer or a total of \$5.76. Under the old ordinance only five stamps were required or a total \$4.80. This motion was seconded by Mr. Dickinson voted on and passed.

There being no other business Mr. David made a motion to adjourn seconded by Mr. Dickinson voted on and passed.
