City Council Met in regular session with all members present.

Meeting was opened by prayer by City Clerk Calvin Caldwell

Minutes of the previous meeting were read by the Clerk and approved by the council.

City Council discussed building a brick wall along the property of Jack Johnson on Line Street . Council decided to build the wall along the East side of the Johnson property on Line Street if Mr. Johnson would sign a bill of release with the City Against any further damages.

Mr. Spink reported that he had some people interested in buying the houses on Line Street owned by the City. After discussion it was decided that the City would wait for awhile before selling the houses.

It Was reported to the council that the State couldn't give any aid on Oothcalooga Street at this time since the Rome Road was being repaired under a defense budget furnished by the Federal Government.

Mr. Dickinson brought before the council some ideas on how to stop speeding on College Street. After discussion no action taken.

Mr. David reported that a Civil Defense School on Atomic matter was being held in Birmingham, Ala. in the near future and that he had asked for one person from the Gordon County Civil Defense Dept. to be enrolled. Mr. David suggested that City Engineer McDaniel be sent to the School and the Council was in agreement. The school would cover radiation fall out among other things.

Council discussed the possibility of purchasing a house for the Nelson family and moving them from their present location on Line Street. Several ideas and locations were discussed with the idea of the City paying for the Nelson Property and giving them property at another location in exchange for the Line Street Property. No definite action taken.

There being no other business the meeting was adjourned.
