

February 24, 1958
Calhoun, Georgia

City Council met in regular session with all members present

Alderman Frank Dickinson opened the meeting with prayer.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read by the clerk and approved by the council.

Mr. Dickinson made a motion that the following people be appointed to serve as the Calhoun Recreation Commission: (1) Bill Spink (2) J.H. Hobgood (3) Vessa Cate (4) Dr. R. D. Walter (5) Mrs. W. R. Norton. This motion was seconded by Mr. David voted on and passed.

Mr. Pete Moore of the Park-O-Meter Company was present and ask the city council to consider purchasing some new parking meters to replace the old Kar-Park parking meters now owned by the city. Mr. Moore stated that he felt sure the city was loosing money by using the old meters. After discussion Mr. Spink made a motion that action on the purchase of these meters be deferred until the council meeting of March 10th. The ~~Street~~ ^{POLICE} Committee to report back at that time. This motion was seconded by Mr. Dickinson voted on and passed.

Mr. David reported that some bushes at the Lula Pitts Home on Line Street had fallen to the sidewalk. Requested the street crew to clean these up since no one lived in the house.

Mr. Bill Spink stated that the City Streets were in need of repair and instructed Mr. McDaniel to start repairing them just as soon as possible.

Mr. Dickinson made a motion that all property owners be required to install a cut-off valve between the city water meter and the property and also a fine be placed on anyone tampering or lifting the water meter lid. Also an Ordinance be drawn up to this effect (Ordinance Attached). This motion seconded by Mr. Woods voted on and passed.


After Discussion of the destroying of a water meter at the Henry Parker residence on Forrest Avenue the Council decided that Mr. Parker be made to pay \$50.00 before water could be restored to the residence.

The Sequoyah Garden Club requested the City to purchase window shades for the South Side of the 3rd floor of the Civic Center. After discussin Mr. David made a motion that the city purchase some shades at the cost of approximately \$35.00. This motion seconded by Mr. Woods voted on and passed.

Mr. Dickinson made a motion that the city clerk be paid expenses if he wishes to attend the clerk and finance shcool to be held at the University of Georgia on March 17, 18. This motion seconded by Mr. Spink voted on and passed.

There being no other business the meeting was adjourned.
