November 24, 1958

City Council met in regular session at the City Hall with all members present. City Clerk Calvin Caldwell was away on a deer hunt and in his absence the minutes were recorded by Mayor Edwards.

The meeting was opened by prayer by Alderman Frank Dickinson.

Mr. Dickinson stated to the council that recreation director Harden Oldfield had closed the Youth Center for a period of 30 days due to several acts of vandalism at the Center and requested the Council to take some action to help get the Center opened again as soon as possible. After discussion no action taken.

Mr. David stated to the Council that an ambulance for use in Civil Defense work was now available at Ft. Benning at a cost of approximately \$60.00 and requested the Council to appropriate funds for the purchase and delivery of said vehicle. Also stated that the Calhoun Jaycee's intended to pay for the ambulance at a later date. Mr. Dickinson made a motion that the City send two employees to Columbus to get the vehicle and pay for the purchase of said vehicle. This motion was seconded by Mr. David voted on and passed.

City Council discussed the new proposed super market to be built at the old Calhoun Hotel Site. After discussion the Council decided to request that property owners Donald Hollingworth and Alton Holcomb give the City 6 feet for additional street space instead of the 4 feet that was previously offered. This space being along Park avenue.

Mr. Woods was heard regarding a sewer line for the residence of Mr. Sam Boston on Harlan Street. Reported that the old line was a private line emptying into the Bill Bond line. Mr. McDaniel reported that the City had cleaned or unstopped the sewer line on this date. After discussion the Council agreed to build a new line to furnish the residence provided Mr. Boston pay the usual \$50.00 tap fee and buy the pipe from his house to the street.

Mr. Dickinson requested and the Council agreed to ask Rep. Buford A. Ingle to have the City Charter changed in the '59 session of the General Assembly to allow any qualified citizen 21 years or over of good moral character to run for any elective position in the City.

Mr. Edwards stated that some brick pillars were needed and ask City Engineer McDaniel to see that they were built at the J. H. Starr tenant house on Line Street. Mr. McDaniel stated that he would take care of the matter just as soon as possible.

City Council agreed to sew grass in yard and build steps with concrete blocks at the home of Jack Johnson on West Line Street.

Mr. David made a motion that the City take necessary steps to give the residences North of Oothcalooga and West of Powell Street fire protection equal to other sections of the City. This motion was seconded by Mr. Woods voted on and passed.

There being no other business Mr. Spink made motion to adjourn seconded by Mr. David voted on and passed.
