City Council met in regular session at the City Hall with all members present.

The meeting was opened with prayer by Alderman Frank Dickinson.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read by the Clerk and approved by the Council.

Alderman David commended Chief Crofford Hayes and Sgt. George Hayes of the City Police Force for work done in connection with the counterfeit bills that were passed in the city. Also stated that the Secret Service commended the two officers.

Mayor Edwards congratulates Aldermen Woods and David on being reelected for another term as Alderman for the City of Calhoun.

Insurance on the new band room was discussed at this time. After discussion Mr. David made a motion that \$30,000 additional insurance be put on the gymnasium and \$5,000 on the contents and that this insurance be given to Harry Lawrence who now operates the Reliable Insurance Agency. This would take care of the band room since it is attached to the gym. This motion was seconded by Mr. Spink voted on and passed. Mr. David, Mr. Spink, Mr. Dickinson voting for the motion and Mr. Woods not voting.

Mr. Dickinson made a motion that the Council pass a resolution and go on record as opposing House Bill No. 721 which would give the Co-ops in Georgia the right to operate in any city that has extended its city limits to an area where the Electrical CO-Ops now operate. Copy of Resolution attached. This motion seconded by Mr. Woods voted on and passed.

Mr. Dickinson made a motion that the City of Calhoun send the City Clerk and City Engineer to Atlanta as soon as possible to get all the facts on Social Security and see what can be worked out. This motion seconded by Mr. Mr. Spink voted on and passed.

There being no other business the meeting was adjourned.
