City Council met in regular session with all members present.

Chief Hayes opened the meeting with prayer.

Minutes of the previous meeting read by the Clerk and adopted by the Council.

Mr. Hollaway and Mr. Roberts were present representing the Phillip "66" Oil Company and ask the Council for permission to build a new service station on South Wall Street. The station was to be built on the old Whittemore lot next to the Hambrick property. After discussion Mr. David made a motion that the Phillip "66" Oil Company be given permission to build a service station on said lot with the approval of the city engineer. This motion was seconded by Mr. Woods voted on and passed.

Mr. Neal Sutherland of the Veterans Cab Co. was present and ask the council for permission to build a small building in the alley back of the Calhoun National Bank to house the radio equipment for his cabs and act as a base station for his cabs. After discussion Mr. Spink made a motion that Veterans Cab Co. be given permission to build a building in the alley as long as it does not interfere with the garbage truck picking up garbage. This motion seconded by Mr. David voted on and passed.

Mr. Glenn Bryant from the Fite's Bend Road was present and ask the council to consider running water to his house. Reported that there was approximately 12 customers on the .7 of a mile in question. The council reported that they would have the City Engineer make a survey and give him an answer in a few days.

James Shopshire was present and ask the council to vote on his beer application to be used at Mann's Place on Fair Street. His partner in the business was to be LeRoy Chatham. There was some question about an Alexander Street Address being used before the Fair Street building was ready but the Council instructed Shopshire that each address would have to be approved by the Council. After discussion Mr. Dickinson made a motion that the beer license be approved and a charge of \$200.00 for the license plus \$200.00 for the bond be set. This motion was seconded by Mr. David voted on and passed.

Mr. Woods reported that the lavatory drain at the Jack Johnson house was still disconnected. Mr. Woods stated that he would like to see the minor things taken care of at the house on Line Street along with small items at other houses in question. Mr. David made a motion that the contracts with the people on Line street be studied and carried out. This motion was seconded by Mr. Woods voted on and passed.


Mr. David ask the council for permission to use city equipment at the high school for the purpose of making a track and atheletic field at the white school and a football field at the colored school. Council granted permission.

Mr. Edwards reported that the football field at the white school had been planted with <sup>FL & BERMUDA</sup> Zoja grass at a cost of approximately \$400.00. Mr. Jack Henslee had been in charge of this project and stated that no topsoil was needed to make a good sod with zoja grass. <sup>& BERMUDA GRASS,</sup>

City Council agreed to pay \$50.00 for two trailers bought for Civil Defense and \$70.00 for two jeeps bought through Civil Defense.

Mr. Spink thought the Council owed Mr. David a word of appreciation for the work he had done for the Civil Defense Department and especially for the job done in getting the two way radios.

Chief Hayes reported that a Mr. Campbell requested a place to park in front of his house on Piedmont next to the Lay<sup>6</sup>Hall Grocery Building. The matter was tabled by the council.
