

1. Mayor Burdette called the meeting to order and gave the invocation.
2. Minutes of the Aug. 28, 1978 regular council meeting were read and approved.
3. Mayor's Comments: Mayor Burdette stated that Slim Kirby's wife had suffered a heart attack and was in Redmond Park Hospital.
- The Mayor also commended Mr. Cate and all involved in obtaining the money from the state for renovating the high school. He also commended the ones that worked so hard on the renovating especially Frank Burnette and spread upon the minutes the Council's appreciation of the excellent job Mr. Burnette did.

5. Public Comments: None
6. Old Business: (a) After discussion Ald. Cox made a motion to condemn the house at 521 Court Street owned by Mr & Mrs. W. D. Putnam, 2nd by Ald. Lewis and approved.
- (b) Supt. Hobgood reported that the street work on Oothcaloga and River Streets was complete. They are now working on College Street from Red Bud Road to Highway 41.
- (c) Supt. Hobgood reported on sewer service for the new I-75 rest area north of Calhoun. It will not be possible to have a gravity flow system; pumping stations will be used. The State would pump the sewer from the rest area to I-75 & Highway 41 with the City pumping from I-75 to Damascus, then gravity flow. The State would like to contract the City to do the work for the pumping station at I-75 and 41.
7. New Business: (a) Supt. Hobgood reported that the sewer cleaning truck and machine ordered some time ago had not arrived. Due to the length of time involved in building the truck a 79 model had been made when the bid was on a 78. The difference in price is \$483.00. Prater Ford asked for the Council's consideration on this difference. After discussion, Supt. Hobgood was instructed to tell Prater Ford the Council's feelings and if they wish to pursue the matter, they will do so at the next meeting.
- (b) The Asst. City Clerk gave the first reading on an ordinance to adopt speed limits for three state routes.
- (c) After discussion Ald. Cox made a motion to adopt a resolution designating the following for the 1978 city election:
- Courthouse as the polling place; Clerk's office as the registrar's office; use of voting machines; Hoyt Edwards was appointed election superintendent; Cathy Harrison as election manager; and two poll workers to be selected by the election manager and pay for the poll workers will be \$36.00 per day.
- 2nd by Ald. Padgett and approved.
- (d) Supt. Hobgood reminded the Council of the Dept. of Transportation meeting on Sept. 27, 1978 at the Holiday Inn.
- (e) The triangle at Meadowbrook Dairy was discussed but no action taken.
8. Ald. Lewis made a motion to adjourn, 2nd by Ald. Padgett and approved.
