City Council met in regular session at the City all with all members present.

Alderman Frank Dickinson Opened the meeting with prayer.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read by the Clerk and approved by the Council.

Mrs. Pearl Shannahan representing the Junior High PTA was present at the meeting and requested that the sidewalk from Owens Street along River Street to the Junior High School be built as soon as possible. After discussion Alderman Norton made a motion that the city build the sidewalk by September 1, 1961 and that it be built out of concrete. This motion was seconded by Alderman Dickinson voted on and passed.

Mr. A. J. Serritt of the Sugar Valley community was present at the meeting and stated to the council that he had an arm broken during an arrest on Saturday Night, April 29, 1961. Stated that he had been in the Gordon County Hospital for a week and was now in the care of a doctor in Rome. Mr. Serritt stated he would be unable to work for a period of five months and ask that the City of Calhoun compensate him in some way during this period. After discussion the council decided to delay any action on the case until more facts were known about the case.

Mr. Bert Lance, chairman of the Recreation Commission, was present and requested that the city help purchase the lights and equipment for the new lighted little league field. After discussion Alderman Woods made a motion that the city give \$1500.00 toward the purchase of the lights. This motion was seconded by Alderman David voted on and passed. Cost of the lights were approximately \$5200.00.


Mr. H. L. Evans was present and requested a malt beverage license at 208 Park Avenue . After discussion the license was refused.

Mr. Burton Bell and Mr. Jack Boston members of the City-County Planning Commission sent letters of resignation to Mayor Hoyt Edwards and suggested that someone be appointed that could give more time to the job since it was now an important part of the area planning. Council delayed action on the appointments.

Supt. James Owens stated that the new front end loader had been purchased from Yancey Bros. of Atlanta and the new machine was a Caterpillar and had been delivered to the city. The trade price was \$15,225 and \$3225.00 had been paid in cash and a note for \$12,000.00 at 6% was being carried by Yancey Brothers for a period of six months.

There being no other business the meeting was adjourned.
