City Council met in regular session at the city hall with all members present.

Police Chief R. C. Hayes opened the meeting with prayer.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read by the clerk and approved by the council.

Alderman Frank Dickinson stated to the council that he thought the city should trade the 1959 police car for a new one. Mayor Edwards and Supt. James Owens stated they thought the council should consider purchasing a new garbage truck also. After discussion the council decided to get bids on the garbage trucks and delay the bids on the new police car for the present.

Mr. Tom David stated to the council that he had matching funds from the federal government for the purchase of two two-way radios and that the council had only approved the purchase of one radio. He ask if the city was interested in purchasing the two radios. After discussion Alderman David made a motion that the city purchase the two radios this motion received a second from alderman Norton voted on and passed.

The Cotton Producers Association had previously requested that the city lease some property near the present city barn to their company for the storage of liquid fertilizer. The council decided against this since no other city property was under lease to private companies.


Council approved a malt beverage license for Charlie Butler on Alexander Street.
