Calhoun, Georgia

City council met in regular session at the city hall with all members present.

Alderman Frank Dickinson opened the meeting with prayer.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read by the clerk and approved by the council.

The Clerk read a veto by Mayor Edwards of the council's action paving Sequoyah Terrace. (Copy attached) There was no motion to override the veto and it stood as read.

Mr. Jimmy Tamplin, Mr. Cliff Long and Mr. Lawrence Stone from the Dews Pond Road was present at the meeting and requested that the city extend the water line to their property a distance of approximately 1/2 mile. The delegation ask if the city would install a one inch pipe if the property owners would purchase the pipe? After discussion Alderman David made a motion that the city assure the delegation that water would be run to their property wheather it be a 1" or 6" line sometime during the summer. That the cost of the 1" line would be refunded to the property owners as new taps were made. This motion was seconded by Alderman Dickinson voted on and passed.

Alderman David expressed his appreciation to the council for the use of the front-end loader at the gun club and requested that he be permitted to use the patrol on Saturday at the club. Council granted permission.

Mayor Edwards was informed by Gordon County Representative C. L. Moss that the Governor had refused to sign the proposed city limit extension bill due to the fact that it was advertised in the local newspaper the same week it was introduced in the legislature. Mayor and council thought it would be wise to delay further action on the proposed bill due to the fact that a new mayor and council would be elected at the end of the year. Mayor Edwards reported that the fire protection bill was killed for the same reason. The mayor also reported that the new subdivision know as Woodland Hills and containing 50 acres was taken into the city.

Mayor Edwards reported that the Georgia Municipal Convention would be held on Jekyll Island June 4, 5, and 6th. Question of who would attend and what expense account would be necessary. Delayed action until next meeting.

Alderman Dickinson stated that bids to trade the 1959 police car for a new one had been received and ask the mayor to open said bids. The bids were as follows:

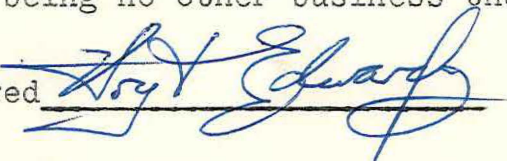

Alderman Dickinson made a motion that the city purchase the chevrolet this was seconded by alderman David voted on and passed.

City council decided to leave the matter of group insurance up to the Mayor, City Supt., and Clerk to decide what to do.

Alderman Woods made a motion that the new ^{Nation's Guard} armory be named in honor of Bernard Franklin. This motion was seconded by alderman David voted on and passed. Mr. Woods stated ^{that} the armory would be named in honor of Mr. Franklin and a resolution ^{was} necessary by the city and a copy ^{of} be sent to the Georgia National Guard. ^{Resolution must} Council agreed to give said resolution.

There being no other business the meeting was adjourned.
