City Council met in regular session at the City Hall with all members present except Alderman Woods, who was absent.

Alderman Dickinson opened the meeting with prayer.

Minutes were read and corrected by the Clerk and approved by the council.

Alderman David made a motion that the city build a sidewalk from the parking lot on Park Avenue to the present city library in the city park. This motion received a second from Alderman Norton was voted on and passed.

Mr. Bert Lance, Chairman of Recreation Commission was present at the meeting and requested that the city set aside funds for operating the recreation program for the year 1961. Stated that the Commission had appeared before the grand jury and ask for additional funds from the county to help pay for the recreation program. Stated that the Commissioner had talked in terms of a one mill tax to help support the program if the grand jury would go along with the one mill. Mr. Lance also requested that the city install a fence around the city property along Fair and Pine Streets. This being necessary to keep children out of the street and to help with the little league baseball program. Alderman David made a motion that the fence along Fair and Pine Streets be install at the request of the Recreation Commission at a cost of approximately \$2000.00. This motion was seconded by Alderman Norton voted on and passed.

Alderman David made a motion that the City of Calhoun provide \$750.00 per month for the city recreation program and this amount be turned over to the Calhoun Recreation Commission at the beginning of each month for the year 1961. This motion was seconded by alderman Dickinson voted on and passed.

Alderman David made a motion that Dr. R. D. Walters be reappointed to the Calhoun Recreation Commission for a period of five years. This motion was seconded by alderman Dickinson voted on and passed.

City Council discussed the possibility of paving Sequoyah Terrace from the old reservoir to the last house east on Hicks Street. Ask Supt. James Owens to look into the cost of said project.

City council agreed to let the Veteran of Foreign Wars and the American Legion sell malt beverages until 11 P.M. on Friday and Saturday nights but other places selling malt beverages must continue ~~to continue~~ to close at 10 P.M. as required by ordinance.

Supt. James Owens stated that the original tank site on Brogdon Mt. had developed a spring and the site had been moved to a new location on the south part of the mountain near the C.C. Hamrick property. Supt. Owens ask the council for permission to raise the pay of Mr. D.A. Stanley and Mr. Raymond Fowler 5¢ per hour. Council granted said permission.

There being no other business the meeting was adjourned.
