City Council met in regular session at the city hall with all members present.

Police Chief R. C. Hayes opened the meeting with prayer.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read by the clerk and approved by the council.

Alderman Frank Dickinson made a motion that the pay of patrolman Virgil Reed Jr. be raised to \$312.40 per month effective with the next pay period. This motion received a second from alderman David and was voted on and passed.

Police Chief R. C. Hayes stated to the council that Dixie Belle Mills had made a request that parking be permitted along West Line Street for office personnel and visitors. After discussion by the council there was no action taken.

Alderman Norton made a motion that the city purchase a traffic light controller to be used in case of an emergency at a cost of approximately \$100.00. This motion received a second from alderman Dickinson and was voted on and passed.

Police Chief R.C. Hayes stated to the council that part of his regular day crew had been working overtime watching for burglars at night and he thought the council should commend these men and it should be made a part of the minutes. Council discussed paying the men overtime but after discussion the Mayor stated that he, Alderman Dickinson, Supt. James Owens, and Chief Hayes would get together and work out something.


Chief Hayes stated to the council that the magazine companies had started a central registry for their salesmen and he thought it would be the answer to checking on each salesman and wondered if the council thought the city should allow salesmen with the central registry card to sell magazines in the city. After discussion the council agreed to leave the ordinance as it now stands.

City Supt. James Owens reported that approximately 750 square feet of floor space could be added to the back of the present city hall at a cost of approximately \$4000.00 to \$4500.00. It had been pointed out that more space was needed in the city hall offices and this was probably the best answer to the problem of enlargement. After discussion Alderman Dickinson made a motion that work be started on the city hall as soon as possible. This motion received a second from Alderman Woods and was voted on and passed.

Mr. Quinton Ward was present at the meeting and ask the council to consider leasing some city property near the present recreation field for the purpose of installing ~~Trampolines~~. Council took the request under advisement.

There being no other business the meeting was adjourned.
