City council met in regular session at the city hall with all members present.

Alderman Frank Dickinson opened the meeting with prayer.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read by the clerk and approved by the council.

Alderman Norton stated to the council that East Line Street from Pisgah Way to the top of the hill at the Fain Cemetery Addition was in need of repair. After discussion Alderman Norton made a motion that East Line Street be repaired with hotmix asphalt from Pisgah Way to the top of the hill at the cemetery if the cost was \$2100.00 or less. This motion received a second from Alderman David voted on and passed.

Civil Defense Director Tom David announced that the new Civil Defense Siren would arrive on August 29th and would be installed on top of the water tank on Victory Drive as soon as possible.


Supt. James Owens reported that a fogging machine had been purchased for the control of flies at the city dump. Mr. Owens also stated that he was having trouble with people dumping garbage all over the dump area rather than in designated areas. This was causing extra work and made it impossible to carry out the new landfill operation now in effect at the dumping area. Mr. Owens ask the council for permission to open the dump from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday and from 7 a.m. to 11 a.m. on Saturday and close the rest of the time. This would be effective Sept. 1, 1961. The council was in unanimous agreement with the plan and instructed Mr. Owens to notify the public through the local paper of the proposed action.

Supt. Owens presented a new hourly pay scale to the council for consideration. The new schedule would class the hourly employees into five classes and the pay would run from \$1.25 per hour to \$2.00 per hour. After discussion by the council the matter was tabled.

Furnishing water and sewer lines for the new Woodlawn Hills Subdivision was discussed by the council. It was estimated that the cost of a pressure line from the proposed sewerage pumping station to the present Valley View pumping station would cost approximately \$1,700.00. After discussion it was the unanimous decision of the council that the owners of Woodlawn Hills Subdivision must pay the cost of the proposed sewerage pumping station, the sewer lines (pressure and gravity), enough monthly minimums to pay the cost of retiring the water lines, and the cost of the sewer lines would be refunded as taps were made on the line for a period of five years.

Mrs. Jewel B. Reeves requested that the city council help her toward getting her new book "Climb the Hills of Gordon" published. Mrs. Reeves stated that she would need approximately \$1600.00 and the County had promised to match anything the city was willing to give. After discussion the council decided that the city could not legally spend money in this manner and the matter was tabled.

There being no other business the meeting was adjourned.
