

JAN. 25, 1971 - REGULAR MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL WITH ALL PRESENT.

1. Rev. Clinton Busler, pastor of Nellie Peters Methodist Church, delivered the invocation.
2. Minutes of the Jan. 11 meeting read and approved.
3. Mayor Dickinson, acting on the advice of City Attorney Shanahan, postponed action on the Roe springs water contract to the Feb. 8 meeting or until the Roe's produce a deed to the property.
4. Ald. Padgett heard in regard to eliminating parking on both sides of Piedmont St. No action taken.
5. The application of E. W. "Buck" Prather for a package malt beverage license in the Gordon Hills Shopping Center read and referred to Ald. Cox, chairman of the special license committee.
6. Mayor Dickinson read a letter from Edna Langford, chairman of the Calhoun Recreation Commission, requesting Council permit the recreation department to use the old dump site. Ald. David moved to allow this request, 2nd by Ald. Cox and approved.
7. Supt. Owens asked Council's permission to raze the old Stephens school building on McConnell Road. Permission granted.
8. Asst. Supt. Fox reported that the old back hoe sold for \$1,887.76 and the old garbage truck for \$300.00. Sealed bids were taken and Herman Cooley and Ernest Owens were high bidders.
9. Ald. David moved to adjourn, 2nd by Ald. Padgett and done.
