

JULY 26. 1971 - REGULAR MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL WITH ALL PRESENT.

1. Ald. Holland delivered the invocation.
2. Minutes of the June 28 meeting read and approved.
3. Jerome Burnette advised that he had purchased his brother's share of the "Psychedelic Shack" on Oothcaloga St. and requested permission to re-open. Mayor Dickinson said the place will not re-open until the Board of Aldermen have had a chance to investigate the situation.
4. Buck Garrett was advised by Mayor Dickinson that the Sutherland building at N. Wall & Nelson Sts. was unsatisfactory as a retail beer outlet.
5. Ald. Holland moved that the cable tv ordinance and pole agreement with Webbs Cable TV be enforced. Ald. Cox seconded and the motion was approved.
6. An ordinance granting the mayor emergency powers was read and adopted following motion of Ald. David and 2nd of Ald. Cox.
7. Elec. Supt. Bell announced that the ball park electrical work was complete and the other improvements are proceeding satisfactorily. He said the 3½ hour power outage on July 18 would have been only 1½ hours as planned, but Georgia Power sent a number of inexperienced employees to do the work.
8. Water Supt. Bowman reported that 318 water taps had been sold to date.
9. Clerk stated that the school bonds will be delivered Thursday, July 29.
10. Asst. Supt. Fox said that residents in the area of Damascus Church were interested in obtaining sanitary sewer service. No action taken.
11. Ald. David moved to adjourn; 2nd by Ald. Holland and done.
