

AUG. 23, 1971 - REGULAR MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL WITH ALL PRESENT.


1. Chaplain T. J. Lance delivered the invocation.
2. Minutes of the Aug. 9 meeting read and approved.
3. Sgt. Lester Rampy, Jr., Cpl. W. L. Davis of the State Patrol, Juvenile Judge J. C. Maddox, Ordinary Harbin King, Police Chief George Hayes, Mayor Frank Dickinson and the Board of Aldermen discussed the problem of unlicensed, youthful drivers primarily on motorcycles and mini-bikes. All agreed to advertise via radio and newspaper that such violations will be charged against the parent and further agreed that the fines will be \$28, 106 & 206 for 1st, 2nd & 3rd offenses.
4. Ald. Padgett heard in regard to parking and littering in shopping center. After discussion, Council agreed to contact owners of the shopping center.
5. Milton Stewart asked Council to extend the sanitary sewer main to the Spring Valley area. Supt. Owens to present estimated cost at the Sept. 13 meeting.
6. Ald. Padgett was advised that the "No Left Turn" sign has been ordered for installation at the north end of Park Avenue.
7. Ald. David said Commissioner DeFoor wanted the grand jury to recommend the county increase their payments to the recreation commission.
8. Ald. David offered a motion that the tax rate for 1971 again be 18 mills, or \$18.00 per thousand dollars of taxable property. Ald. Padgett seconded and the motion was approved.
9. Ald. Holland moved the adoption of the attached retirement plan as prepared by the Calhoun First National Bank. Ald. Cox 2nd and the motion was voted on and passed. Ald. Holland pointed out that this is a non-participating plan.
10. Supt. Owens advised that the city had started work on the north Industrial Blvd. prior to paving by the state.
11. Council adopted a resolution requesting the Dept. of Transportation to expedite acceptance of the State Highway Dept's. route for I-75.
12. Council delayed acceptance of L. M. Lovinggood's petition for annexation of his property to the city.
13. Council instructed the clerk to give Webb's Cable TV 30 days to pay its indebtedness to the city.
14. Ald. David moved to adjourn, 2nd by Ald. Padgett and done.
