

DEC. 13, 1971 - REGULAR MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL WITH ALL PRESENT.

1. Chaplain T. J. Lance delivered the invocation.
2. Minutes of the regular meeting of Nov. 22 and the called meeting of Dec. 10 read and approved.
3. John Cunningham and John Slagle asked Council to extend sanitary sewer service along SR 53 to I-75. Mr. Cunningham presented a plan whereby property owners would pay a pro rata share of the cost. After discussion, Mayor Dickinson called a special meeting on Dec. 17 at 5 PM to consider this matter, but promised no definite answer at the Dec. 27 meeting.
4. County School Supt. Wayne Ashworth said the state will build a new elementary school on SR 53 at Scottsville and a new junior high school north of Tom Greeson's residence on Columbus Circle. Council approved water for the Scottsville school and asked Supt. Owens to acquire an estimate and advise as to cost of installing sewer to the proposed junior high location.
5. Frank Ward and Howard Robinson said they were representing several residents on Sherwood and Woodland Dr. and requested Council to stop Jack Mealer from operating his produce business in a residential zone. Ald. Holland moved to advise Mr. Mealer that he is in violation of the city code, 2nd by Ald. Padgett and passed. (City Bldg. Insp. to check with City Attorney Shanahan prior to informing Mr. Mealer.)
6. Ald. Holland introduced Bill Sanders of Sanders and Associates who explained several programs the federal government will participate in and the percentage of grants allowable.
7. Ald. Padgett moved to require all apartments of 4 or more units to have a 3 cubic yard garbage container with larger apartments to have as many containers as deemed necessary by the Sanitation Dept. Supt. Ald. Cox 2nd and the motion was voted on and passed.
8. Ald. David heard in regard to increasing water and sewer rates. This to be handled at the Dec. 17 meeting.
9. Supt. Owens advised that the motor vehicle liability policy had increased approximately \$1,000 this year and suggested becoming self insured.
10. Ald. Holland advised that L. M. Lovinggood, Jr. had requested an estimate of the cost to extend sanitary sewer service to his business.
11. Supt. Owens said Calhoun Investors were seeking to close several streets in the Mason S/D which they own.
12. Supt. Owens said the county had agreed to pay half the cost of extending utilities to the proposed Welcome Center north of town. Ald. Holland moved to sign a contract with the county to this effect and advise the state. 2nd by Ald. Cox and approved.
13. Council authorized clerk to advise Lex Jolley to proceed with a \$1,100,000 issue of water & sewer revenue bonds following motion of Ald. Holland and Padgett.
14. Council approved water taps recommended by the committee on motion of Ald. Holland and second of Ald. Cox.
15. Ald. Cox moved to annex the property of Mrs. Hilda H. Moss on the Red Bud Rd. adjacent to Stuckey's and the property of Jack Holland and Jack Knight off the Henderson Bend Rd.; 2nd by Ald. Padgett and approved.

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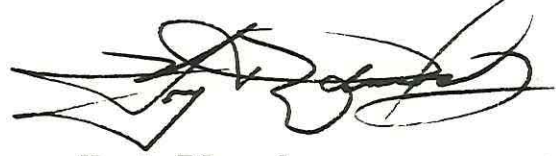

17. Clerk advised that Mayor Clyde York of Plainville had asked Council to consider permitting the Town of Plainville to collect water bills.
18. Ald. Padgett moved to adjourn, 2nd by Ald. Holland and done.
