

OCT. 25, 1971 - REGULAR MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL WITH ALL PRESENT.

1. Chaplain T. J. Lance delivered the invocation.
2. Minutes of regular meeting of Oct. 11 read and approved.
3. Donald Bearden asked about availability of water to Dew's Pond and was advised to wait until Dec. 1 for his answer.
4. Ald. David heard in regard to increasing the dues paid the Chamber of Commerce. Ald. Holland suggested that the chamber office might earn an increase by advising the city of federal programs and grants. No action taken.
5. Ald. David said library employees were interested in social security and asked the clerk to investigate if they could be eligible.
6. Ald. David said he was still working on a community center for the West Side.
7. Ald. David advised the Environmental Protection Agency had rejected the proposed EOC at the sewage treatment plant.
8. Ald. Cox reported several complaints of crossing blocking by the L & N switch engine at Line and Court Streets.
9. Ald. Cox and Chief Hayes said they had hoped the Federal Omnibus Crime & Safe Streets Act would make funds available for the purchase of a police cruiser, but the state committee failed to allocate Calhoun anything.
10. Ald. Holland suggested increasing water rates from 25¢ to 30¢ inside the city and from 30 to 45¢ per thousand gallons outside and changing the sewer charge to a flat 50% of the water bill.
11. Council discussed installation of a pump in the water main serving Buford Chitwood's plant at Resaca.
12. Ald. Holland asked Water Supt. Bowman to explain Leslie Barnette's request for water near Weberdale Heights S/D. Mr. Bowman said the subdivision could be served with a 2" main, but a 4" line should be installed for future expansion. Mayor Dickinson said the city is financially unable to make such an extension at this time.
13. Asst. Supt. Fox explained that J. W. Moss, Jr. could not be served at his subdivision near McDaniel's Station because the elevation is too high.
14. Ald. Holland said L. M. Lovinggood, Jr. had requested annexation of his property even if the city cannot furnish him with sanitary sewer now. No action taken.
15. Ald. Holland said the CFNB's trust officer is working on a retirement plan for city employees.
16. Supt. Owens heard in regard to installation of a 12" gate valve in S. Industrial Park. Council agreed to install if plants will buy.
17. Supt. Owens re welcome station north of city at I-75. Council agreed to proceed with plans provided the county will pay half the cost.
18. Ald. Holland moved to approve water taps recommended by the water committee. 2nd by Ald. Cox and approved.


19. Water Supt. Bowman said Milton Stewart had water in half his s/d at Brownlee Mtn. and has requested service to the other half. Council agreed since Mr. Stewart had been promised service at an earlier date.
20. Housing Director J. C. Boyd was assured by the Council that the city will install utilities to the new housing project.
21. Asst. Supt. Fox said the Van Buskirk property on S. Wall will be condemned as unfit for human habitation.
22. Ald. David moved to adjourn, 2nd by Ald. Padgett and done.
