City Council met in regular session at the City Hall with all members being present except Mr. Tom David who was away on a hunting trip to the midwest.

Chief Hayes opened the meeting with prayer.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read by the Clerk and approved by the Council.

Mr. Woods reported that residents that live near the Beamer Gin Co. was complaining about the amount of dust in the air that was caused by ginning cotton. After discussion Mayor Edwards reported that he would talk to Mr. Beamer and see what could be worked out.

Mr. Spink reported to the council that bids on a new 1/2 ton truck for the Street Department was received as follows:

Alderman Spink stated that the Chevrolet had been purchased from Davis Bros. Chev. Co. at the above price.

Mr. Spink made a suggestion that the Court Room be moved down to the Civic Center Building to allow more space for the Police and Clerk's office. No Action taken on the matter at this time.

Alderman Dickinson stated that Mr. John Hughes wanted to compliment the city crew on the work done on the sewer line on Valley Circle.

Mayor Edwards brought the problem of parking on College Street across from the Grammar School before the Council. The area involved would be on the West side of College Street from Fain Street to Line Street. It was decided to get the city attorney to draw up an ordinance banning parking in this area.

Mayor Edwards stated that the house and store building at Mr. Jack Johnsons on West Line Street was still in need of repair from the moving during the construction of the new street. Mr. Spink made a motion that the City Pay Mr. Harry Smith the some of \$250.00 to repair this house. This motion received a second from Mr. Dickinson voted on and passed.

Mayor Edwards reported that he and Alderman Spink had made plans to attend the Municipal Association to be held in Dalton on October 28.

There being no other business the meeting was adjourned.
