

July 13, 1959
Calhoun, Georgia

City Council met in regular session at the City Hall with all members present.

Mayor Hoyt Edwards called the meeting to order and Alderman Frank Dickinson opened the meeting with prayer.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read by the Clerk and Approved by the Council.

Mr. David made a motion that the intersection of Maple and Park Avenue be changed to make Park Avenue the street requiring a stop sign instead of Maple Street. This being done to keep traffic off of the railroad track. This motion received a second from Mr. Spink voted on and passed.

Mayor Hoyt Edward's veto of the proposed water line running to the Kuhlman property was read to the council at this time. Mayor Edward's veto is attached to said minutes. Mayor Edwards called for a discussion of the veto and there was no opposition to the veto so Mayor stated to the council that the veto was to stand as read.

The Clerk read a letter from Mr. A. A. Graves expressing his appreciation to the Mayor and Council for the fine support he had received from them while serving as City Superintendent of Schools.

L. C. Smith a colored citizen from Westside was present at the meeting and requested a license to open a pool room on Alexander Street. Stated that he would have two tables and they would be the coin operated type. Alderman Dickinson made a motion that a pool room license be issued to L. C. Smith for the amount of \$75.00 and that he be given until August 1st to purchase said license. This motion received a second from Alderman Spink voted on and passed.

Alderman Woods stated that the cesspool at the armory was in need of enlarging and requested the council to give permission to help with the ditch digging and other matters that it would take for the job. Council agreed to let the city help with job.

Alderman David made a motion that the water line to the Vern Kuhlman subdivision be finished and the water turned on when taps and deposits were paid. This motion received a second from Alderman Dickinson voted on and passed.

Mr. Thurman Chitwood was present and ask the council that if he could secure a mill for the Resaca area would the city install a standpipe or furnish proper water flow for fire or sprinkler protection to the area. Stated it would be near the present water line. Council assured Mr. Chitwood the city would take care of any water needs required by the mill.


Mayor Edwards announced the resignation of Mr. A. R. McDaniel Jr. as City Engineer to become effective August 1, 1959. Mr. McDaniel expressed his appreciation to the city and council for the support and fine cooperation he had received during his working days with the city. Council also states they hate to see him leave but know he is bettering himself and this is always a pleasure to see anyone do.

Mayor Edwards stated that he and Mr. Spink and Mr. Woods would attend the Georgia Municipal Association in Macon from July 19th through July 21st. Council agreed to pay expenses of Mayor and Alderman to said convention.

Alderman Dickinson made a motion that transportation to a police fingerprinting school be furnished for Lt. George Hayes and Patrolman Virgil Reed Jr. to be held in Rome on July 20th through 24th. This motion received a second from Mr. David voted on and passed.

Alderman Dickinson made a motion to adjourn seconded by Mr. David voted and passed.
