Calhoun, Georgia

City Council met in regular session at the City Hall with all members present.

Chief Hayes opened the meeting with prayer.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read by the clerk and approved by the council.

Mr. Lee Evans appeared before the council due to reports that he had been running his place of business while intoxicated. Mr. Evans stated that he had drank two or three beers to help his cold while working at his place of business. Stated that he felt bad most of the time and was staggering due to his sickness. Chief Hayes reported that Mr. Evans acted as though he had been drinking on making a recent visit to his establishment. After discussion the council instructed Mr. Evans to either sell his place of business or get a manager that was approved by the Mayor and Council within 60 days or to close the place.

Mr. David stated that he and Mayor Edwards had made a visit to the S.M. Harrison lot on Victory Drive to see what fire damage was done by the City. Mr. Harrison ask \$300.00m damage. Mr. Dickinson made a motion that action on the lot be tabled until the next meeting and this would give the council a chance to look at the lot before making a decision. This motion was seconded by Mr. David voted on and passed.

Mr. David made a motion that a two foot strip on the North side of Court be paved from King Street West to River Street. This motion was seconded by Mr. Spink voted on and passed.

Mr. McDaniel reported that the 2" water line to the Fite's Bend Road was in the process of being built and that the 800 feet of 1" pipe now in the ground would be replaced this summer.

Mr. David made a motion that the city purchase four 5 row high bleacher seats from the U. S. Seating Company at a cost of \$129.60 plus freight. A second to this motion was made by Mr. Spink voted on and passed. These bēachers were to be placed at the recreation parks for their use.

Mr. David reported that Mr. Marvin Acree was teaching a course on Radiation Fall*Out during the next week and requested that someone from the water, police and other departments attend the school.

The Council agreed that where power was available by the city all persons must purchase city power before water could be purchased. This reaffirmed the water situation at the residence of Mr. Luke Fair on Louise Avenue.

Council agreed to enlarge the water meter at the residence of Mr. Sim Sutherland if he would enlarge his service line to the house from the meter.

There being no other business the meeting was adjourned.
