

November 9, 1959
Calhoun, Georgia

City Council met in regular session at the city hall with all members being present.

Alderman Frank Dickinson opened the meeting with prayer.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read by the clerk and approved by the Council.

Mr. Tom B. David, Calhoun Civil Defense Director, stated to the council that a Civil Defense Meeting would be held in Macon on the 18th and 19th of November and requested that the Mayor and any other interested parties attend the meeting with him. Alderman Spink made a motion that the expenses of the Civil Defense group be paid for attending the Macon meeting. This motion was seconded by Alderman Dickinson voted on and passed.

Mr. David ask the Council the possibility of getting the classrooms at the colored gym insulated to make it warmer. The council decided to contact the school board and see what could be worked out.

Alderman Spink made a motion that a photostatic copy of all important water and sewer lines of the City of Calhoun be made and placed on file for future use. Council decided to investigate the cost of such a project and take action at a later date.

Alderman Spink stated to the council that he thought the pool room ordinance should be enforced and that the age for visting a pool room should be eighteen years of age. No action taken by the council.

Mayor Edwards read a petition from the property owners along Court Street from King to River Street requesting the city to curb and gutter said street. There ~~is~~^{are} nine property owners on this street and six of them had signed the petition, which is required by the charter. Mr. Spink made a motion that the curb and gutter work be started when the 2/3 property owners along said Court Street put the money for said job up in advance. This motion received a second from Mr. Dickinson voted on and passed.

Chief Hayes reported to the council that residents along McConnell Road requested that a no parking ordinance be passed and enforced to stop parking at the crest of the hills along McConnell Road. Council decided to have an ordinance drawn up to enforce said parking.

Mayor Edwards reported that the Dave R. Nelson's were having trouble getting a clear title to the Nelson property on West Line Street. Stated that Mr. John A. Gregory reported to him in letter form that it would take approximately \$500.00 to secure a clear title to the property. Mr. Gregory suggested that a clear title be secured before the City of Calhoun took any action toward trying to settle the matter.

Purchase of Street Signs discussed at this time. Council tabled action on said matter.

There being no other business the meeting was adjourned.
