City Council met in regular session at the City Hall with all members being present.

Alderman Frank Dickinson opened the meeting with prayer.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read by the Clerk and approved by the Council.

Construction of the new electrical trunk feeder was discussed at this time. Bids from the following companies were opened at this time:

Marable-Pirkle, Inc., Atlanta, Georgia-----	\$14,340.00.
Harrison-Wright Co., Inc., Charlotte, N.C.	8,625.00
R. H. Bouligny, Inc., Charlotte, N. C.	12,235.00

After discussion Mr. Dickinson made a motion that the contract for building the new electrical trunk feeder be awarded to Harrison-Wright Company, Inc. of Charlotte, N. C. for the amount of \$8,625.00. This motion received a second from Mr. Tom David. Voted on and passed by the Council.

Mr. David reported that a Civil Defense Rescue Demonstration would be held in East Point, Georgia on October 6, 1959 and asked permission to use some of the Civil Defense equipment at this demonstration. Council granted said permission.


A letter from Mr. Roger K. Brown, City Recreation Director, was read by Mayor Edwards. In the letter Mr. Brown outlined the recreation program for the past summer and the intentions of the department for the fall season. Also ask that a windshield be purchased for the department jeep and someone to clean the recreation center on Monday of each week.

Property tax millage was discussed by the council. After discussion Mr. David made a motion that the tax millage rate for the year 1959 be set at 22 mills. This motion received a second from Mr. Woods voted on and passed.

Mr. Spink stated that the sidewalk from the Junior High School to the Senior High School was in need of repair. Stated that the PTA wanted hotmix or concrete but thought new gravel would be satisfactory. Also stated that Mrs. Tom Shanahan, president of the PTA, had suggested a sidewalk from River Street to the entrance of the Senior High School. It was also pointed out that the U.S. Mail service had to use this route for mail delivery. Council agreed to fix said walks.

There being no other business the meeting was adjourned.
