

February 9, 1959
Calhoun, Georgia

City Council met in regular session at the City Hall with Mayor Edwards, Alderman Dickinson, Alderman Woods and Alderman David being present. Alderman Spink being absent due to illness.

Alderman Dickinson opened the meeting with prayer.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read by the Clerk and approved by the Council.

Pay scale for city employees was brought up for discussion at this time. After discussion the council decided to have a special meeting to go over the pay of employees and decide if a pay raise was to be granted. Mr. David suggested that the pay raise be made retroactive to February 1, 1959. Stated Social Security would be studied at this time.

Alderman David stated to the council that some of the women of the city had requested to him that wire be put over the windows on the ground level at the civic center and that the pit where the old boiler stood be filled to protect the children while playing around the youth center. Council instructed the city engineer to look into the matter and see what could be done.

Alderman David made a motion that the city council notify representative Buford A. Ingle to withdraw the bill that had been introduced into the House of Representative allowing the people of the city and community to vote for or against annexation and hold said bill until further consideration by the council. This motion was seconded by Mr. Woods voted on and passed.

Buford Textile, Inc. located on McConnell Road requested that the city run a 6" water line parallel to the existing 4" water line from Court Street to the plant site. This being required to satisfy the Southeastern Underwriters for a sprinkler system. Council decided that if Buford Textile would pay for the existing 4" line the city would install a 6" at no cost to the plant.

Mr. W. R. Fricks ask the city to extend a storm drain by his property in Valley View Subdivision. There being approximately 100 feet involved in the extension and 36" pipe required the council decided that the city would install the pipe if Mr. Fricks would purchase the pipe.

There being no other business Mr. David made a motion to adjourn seconded by Mr. Dickinson voted on and passed.
