

October 12, 1959
Calhoun, Georgia

City Council met at the City Hall at 7:30 PM with all members present.

The meeting was opened with prayer by the Rev. Org Foster pastor or the Echota Baptist Church.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read by the Clerk and approved by the Council.

The application of Mr. Charles P. Thompson for a Beer License at 718 North Wall Street was read at this time. The Rev. Org Foster, Pastor of the Echota Baptist Church presented a number of petitions along with signers in opposition to the granting of a Beer License at the above location. After discussion Mr. Dickinson made a motion that the application for a Beer License at 718 N. Wall Street be denied or rejected because of the location. Mr. David seconded the motion and it was voted on and passed. Mr. Dickinson explained that it was because of the location that he made his motion and not because he had anything against the applicant, Mr. Charles P. Thompson.

Mr. David reported that Mr. Sam Boston wanted the City to build the sewer line from the street to his house and let him pay the cost. Council agreed to dig the ditch for Mr. Boston but he must do the other work involved.

Mr. David reported that rifles and BB guns were being fired in the city and he suggested that the ordinance against such be enforced and and ad be placed in the paper to help enforce the ordinance.

Mr. Spink reported that residents along Court Street between King and River Streets had requested that something be done about the water and condition of the street. Mr. Spink made a motion that a survey of Court Street be made and furnish the residents along said street the cost of Curb and Gutter. This motion was seconded by Mr. David voted on and passed.

Mr. Woods made a motion that the funeral homes in Calhoun be notified that they would be responsible for digging graves and moving dirt in the Fain Cemetery as of this date. This motion received a second from Mr. David voted on and passed.

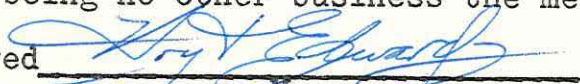
Mayor Edwards brought before the council the matter of purchasing the electrical equipment needed for the substation for the new electrical trunk feeder being built under contract. After discussion Mr. David made a motion that the equipment be purchased from the Graybar Corporation and that the equipment be General Electric Equipment. This would include 3 regulators and 1 circuit breaker at a cost of \$14, 210. This motion was seconded by Mr. Dickinson voted on and passed.

A letter from Mr. Roger K. Brown, Director of Recreation, was read by Mayor Edwards. The letter explained the work that was going on in the recreation department at this time.

Mr. David made a motion that 1400 feet of 6" water pipe be purchased for the extension needed in the Cherry Hill Subdivision and the electric line be built when needed. This motion was seconded by Mr. Spink voted on and passed.

There being no other business the meeting was adjourned.
