

1. The meeting was called to order by Mayor Burdette.
2. Charles D. and W. Rhode Hill of Reynolds Securities, Inc. presented an agreement to the Council regarding the proposed general obligation bond referendum and following bond issue should the referendum pass. Decisions concerning agreements for the pending bond issue will be made Sept. 22, 1975, at the regular council meeting.
3. A resolution covering acquisition and clearance of rights of way for city streets, Cherry Hill, Neal, Riverview, East Line, Pisgah Way, Meadow Lane and Hunt Drive was adopted after a motion by Ald. Padgett and a 2nd by Ald. Collins.
A motion was made by Ald. Padgett for the City to increase the plant mix paving on Meadow Lane to a 2" depth, (estimated cost \$14,250.00) to a 1½" depth on Garden Hills (\$4350.00) and Stone Haven (\$3675.00) and 1" depth on Memorial and part of Pine St. at an estimated cost of \$2115.00. The paving would be increased to a 2" depth on Pisgah Way also. The City would pay an estimated \$26,000.00 in addition to the 3.14 miles of 1" depth provided by the State, for the streets of Cherry Hill, Neal, Riverview, East Line, Pisgah Way, Meadow Lane and Hunt Drive, 2nd by Ald. Cox and approved.
4. Police Chief Macomber reported on the possibility of trading a used intoximeter machine for a tranquilize~~r~~ gun for the dog problem.
Chief Macomber requested two new police cars to be used on patrol duty, exchanging the two oldest vehicles for the traffic patrol division. The Council requested that a delivery date be determined and the request resubmitted at the Sept. 22, 1975, Council meeting.
5. Robbie Cox requested permission for a temporary building to be erected on the lot owned by Dr. Billings fronting on Line St. The building to be used as a short order restaurant. Ald. Collins made a motion to approve the request provided that city codes were met, 2nd by Ald. Padgett and approved.
6. Fire Chief Grizzle requested permission to add an additional step in his promotion schedule for firemen. The direct promotion of men would be on a merit examination basis. The Council unanimously agreed to the request.
7. Ald. Padgett made a motion to approve a water tap for Mr. Hill Fox, 2nd by Ald. Cox and approved.
8. The Council discussed problems and possible solutions for a report to the Neighbor Service Centers.
