City Council met in call session at the city hall with all members present.

Mayor Edwards called the meeting for the purpose of discussing the proposed city limit extension and to decide wheather the city should allow the people to vote on the proposed extension by referendum.

Mayor Edwards stated that he had talked with Mr. Elmer George of the Georgia Municipal Association and with Mr. Bill Manton of the North Georgia Electric Membership Corporation to try and see what could be worked out on the problems that would be faced in extending the city limits of Calhoun. Mr. Manton stated that they would not be interested in selling the power system in south end of the city and Mr. George stated that he thought the problem could be worked out by offering the new proposed residents a choice of two contracts. After a lengthy discussion Alderman Dickinson made a motion that the city council reject the proposal by the City-County Planning Commission to call for a referendum on the proposed city limit extension until a survey by competent engineers could be made and the problems to be faced could be worked out. This motion received a second from Alderman Norton voted and passed.
