

1. Hoyt Edwards and Tom Shanahan met with North Georgia Electric Membership representatives relative to the power situation in Spring Valley pursuant to NGEMC claims that the City is in violation of House Bill 2. Motion for the city to hook up power, for Hoyt Edwards, Jack Bell, Tom Shanahan and Milton Stewart to go to the Georgia Public Service Commission and get a ruling.
2. Hoyt Edwards brought up square footage requirements for the Carriage Apartments. Ordinance states that 10⁷ square feet for the first ² units and 5⁷ square feet for each remaining unit is specified. Council recommended Hoyt Edwards contact the builder and inform him of these requirements, as additional land will be needed by builder or a reduced number of units should be built. Also each apartment is to have its own electric meter and water meter. Approved.
3. Hoyt Edwards brought up the old addressograph equipment that is surplus. Council agreed to have this equipment sold for the best price. Passed.
4. Jack Bell brought up the fact that he has some surplus 4 m volt transformers that could be sold. Motion by Ald. Padgett, 2nd by Ald. Cox that these be sold. Carried.
5. Bruce Bowman brought up the fact that if Carriage Apartments only uses two big water meters, as their drawings show that a minimum be charged for each apartment on the premises, whether occupied or not, plus usage over the minimum. Passed.
6. Ald. Padgett made a motion to adjourn, 2nd by Ald. Cox.
