City Council met in call session at the city hall with all members present.

The council met in call session with Mr. John Corley and Mr. A. R. McDaniel of the new Continental Carpet Mills, Inc. This company proposed to build a new plant on the Kuhlman Property north of the city. The company requested the City of Calhoun to run water to their property on Industrial Blvd. a distance of approximately 1500 feet. After discussion Alderman David made a motion that the City of Calhoun run a 10 inch water line for usage and a 10 inch water line for a sprinkler to the Continental Carpet Mills, Inc. property on Industrial Blvd. north of the City of Calhoun. The distance for running said lines to be approximately 1500 feet. These lines would be run at no cost to the Continental Carpet Mills, Inc. This motion received a second from Alderman Lewis was voted on and passed.

There being no other business the meeting was adjourned.
