LANDFILL COMMITTEE WORK SESSION

1. Ground water monitoring plans discussed. County Plan and City Plan have both been initially reviewed by the State and returned for changes.

Group discussed possibility of having one outside firm monitor City/County wells (approximately 14 each).

City/County Plans to be reviewed to make sure no duplication of wells are in the plans.

2. Montanaro reviewed the status of the vertical lift application on file with the State by the County. Montanaro stated he and Attorney Maddox were going to the State on May 31, 1991 in regard to the lift application, and asked Meadows and Cornwell to go also.
3. The group discussed the need for a contract covering tipping fees, sludge handling, maintenance and monitoring.
4. The County's time table for opening the new site is 12 to 15 months following approval of the site by the State. The City has scheduled to cease operation of its site on June 30, 1991. A Closure Plan is being drawn.
5. The County will apply for permission to compost inert material outside the liner area at the new landfill site, including sludge waste.
6. The Group discussed landfill equipment operated by each government and owned jointly. It was suggested each government issue a bill of sale for its one-half interest in the equipment operated by the other government. Harrison and McDearis were asked to review.
7. Following discussion of the City's daily average of sludge, Montanaro suggested an annual maximum of \$125,000.00 based on 4,166 tons quarterly, and overage to be charged \$7.50 per ton.
8. In order to distribute landfill fees, the County will need the City's operating cost for the period of October 1, 1991 through June 30, 1991 including administrative cost and any work performed at the landfill by other departments.
9. The group discussed recycling efforts following opening of the new landfill. The City stated it would need two or three recycling units if the County provides these.
